THE SURVEY ALSO INDICATED THAT 68 PERCENT OF ADULT AMERICANS ENGAGE WITH THE BIBLE AS THEY FEEL IT BRINGS THEM CLOSER TO GOD AND STRENGTHENS THEIR FAITH. SOME 58 PERCENT OF AMERICANS ALSO LONG TO SPEND MORE TIME READING AND ENGAGING WITH THE BIBLE, WHICH PROVIDES AMERICAN BIBLE SOCIETY WITH FERTILE GROUND TO CONTINUE TO GROW OUR MINISTRY TO HELP PEOPLE ACCESS AND ENGAGE WITH THE BIBLE, AS WELL AS ENSURE FUTURE GENERATIONS CAN FULLY EXPERIENCE ITS LIFE CHANGING MESSAGE.

ADDITIONAL FINDINGS FROM THE 2017 STATE OF THE BIBLE SURVEY INCLUDE:

NEARLY ONE HALF OF ALL ADULTS (48 PERCENT) BELIEVE THE BIBLE HAS TOO LITTLE INFLUENCE IN AMERICAN SOCIETY TODAY AND THAT MORE NEEDS TO BE DONE TO RESTORE THE BIBLE'S INFLUENCE HERE.

IN THE UNITED STATES TODAY, MOST PEOPLE HAVE A BIBLE, BUT NOT EVERYONE READS IT. THAT'S WHY WE'RE WORKING TOGETHER WITH MINISTRY AND FINANCIAL PARTNERS TO ADVOCATE FOR THE BIBLE IN OUR CULTURE AND EQUIP LOCAL CHURCHES AND COMMUNITIES TO SHARE THE MESSAGE OF SCRIPTURE WITH THOSE WHO NEED IT MOST.

WHETHER PEOPLE DON'T HAVE TIME TO READ THE BIBLE, DON'T KNOW WHERE TO START, OR DOUBT THE RELEVANCE OF THE BIBLE'S MESSAGE FOR THEIR LIVES, AMERICANS NEED HELP BREAKING DOWN THE BARRIERS THAT PREVENT THEM FROM READING AND BEING CHANGED BY GOD'S WORD.

THE TREND OF BIBLE ENGAGEMENT IS DECLINING WHILE BIBLE SKEPTICISM IS RISING IN THE U.S. TODAY. AS FEWER AMERICANS READ, STUDY, AND SHARE GOD'S WORD, WE HAVE AN OPPORTUNITY TO COUNTER THE TREND STARTING IN CITIES. THROUGH COLLABORATION WITH URBAN CHURCHES AND COMMUNITY LEADERS, WE CAN EQUIP MORE PEOPLE IN MORE U.S. CITIES TO ENGAGE WITH GOD'S WORD. CHURCH AND COMMUNITY LEADERS FROM PHOENIX TO NEW YORK CITY WANT TO SHARE THE LIFE CHANGING MESSAGE OF GOD'S WORD. BUT MANY OF THEM LACK THE RESOURCES THEY NEED TO EFFECTIVELY REACH THEIR COMMUNITIES WITH THE BIBLE. TO DELIVER THE GOOD NEWS OF JESUS CHRIST IN THESE DIVERSE URBAN CONTEXTS, LEADERS MUST HAVE

CONTENT CAN INCLUDE A MAIN PASSAGE OF SCRIPTURE, COMMENTARY, IMAGES, VIDEOS, SUPPORTING PASSAGES, AND MORE.

BIBLEMINDED APP: A MOBILE APP, IT IS DESIGNED TO HELP INDIVIDUALS READ AND MEMORIZE SCRIPTURE. USERS CAN PICK FROM A GROWING LIST OF MEMORIZATION PLANS, TRACK THEIR PROGRESS, AND SEARCH FOR SPECIFIC VERSES ON THEIR PHONE OR TABLET.

BUILD YOUR BIBLE APP: A MOBILE APP THAT EQUIPS YOUTH TO GROW IN BIBLE KNOWLEDGE. BUILT SPECIFICALLY FOR THE CATHOLIC COMMUNITY, THIS APP OFFERS OPPORTUNITIES FOR YOUTH TO PLAY ALONE, OR USE FACEBOOK TO CHALLENGE THEIR FRIENDS TO A FRIENDLY, SCRIPTURE BASED GAME.

WE ARE CREATING A TRUSTED SOURCE FOR GOD'S WORD ONLINE THROUGH OUR .BIBLE TOP LEVEL DOMAIN, OPENING BROADER ONLINE ACCESS FOR NEW AUDIENCES.

THROUGH THESE DIGITAL RESOURCES, WEBSITES, SCRIPTURE ENGAGEMENT APPS, AND MINISTRY TOOLS, WE ARE ABLE TO HELP MORE PEOPLE ENCOUNTER GOD IN HIS WORD IN A FORMAT THAT INTEGRATES WITH THEIR DAILY LIVES.
